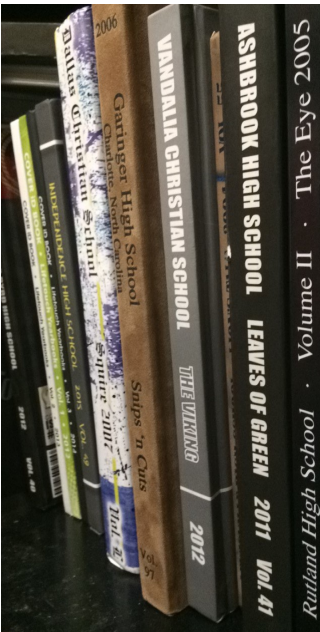

Some things the high schoolers at Great Falls said about the yearbook and what it means to them

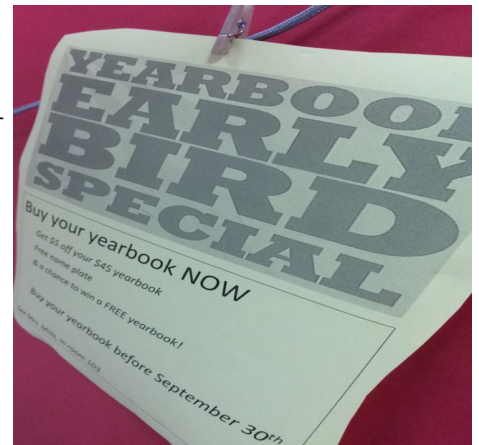

football team.

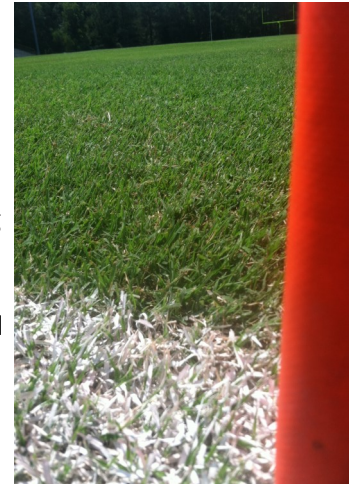

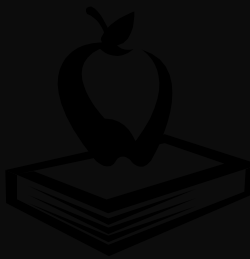
