

On this Day in History

Fidel Castro became the President of Cuba on December 2nd of 1976, replacing former president Osvaldo Dorticos Torrado. Castro was a Marxist enforcing Communism upon Cuba later forcing the country to fall solely under his dictatorship. Castro lead Cuba as their leader until 2008 when he handed his power down to his brother Raul. Fidel was consid-

ered to be one of the worst leaders in the history of Cuban leaders. Although he was considered to be the worst leader, he was very well at handling terrible situations. Castro's communist revolution began to fail when the Soviet Unions economy did. With no one other than the Soviet Union to help, the economy began to under-go inflation (The



Way to stay on the Devil level Zy'kevious!




The Brady Bunch Star Leaves a Legacy

Actress Florence Henderson, the famous mother on the *Brady Bunch*, passed away on November 24, 2016 at Ceders-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles.

Henderson played the role of Carol Martin, the mother of Marci, Jan, and Cindy and the step-mother of Greg, Peter, and Bobby in *The Brady Bunch*.

Growing up, Henderson's family struggled financially. She was the youngest of 10 children and her father was a sharecropper.

She recalled working by the age of 8 in an interview with *The New York Times*. She worked as a babysitter, cleaned other people's homes, and also sang songs in exchange for groceries.

Henderson's career began when she was an ingénue soprano in stage musicals in the 1950s, according to the same article written by Anita Gates from *The New York Times*.

Henderson was making a film when she was asked to appear in the pilot episode of *The Brady Bunch*. This show lasted from September 1969 to March 1974.

Henderson commented on the show saying, "It was really a show that was seen through the eyes of a child, and it was supposed to have a little soft glow about it."

Junior Hannah McCormick recalled watching *The Brady Bunch* and said,

"I liked Florence Henderson playing Carol because she was a great mom figure in the show."

The series was about a widowed mother of three named Carol, who married an architect named Mike Brady. Mike was a widower and a father of three sons.

It focused on the problems of all the children with ages spanning from preschool to teenagers.

After 177 episodes, ABC cancelled the show. The last episode aired on August 30th 1974, but later had popular reruns of the show.

Mrs. Coleman, a janitor at Great Falls High School said, "I liked the show because it was fun because there was always chaos in the household."
